

Hosts for the Sept. 25th EXCOM meeting were Barbara and Jim Wingrove. Others present were Marilyn Clark, Gail Gell, Bob Marx, Larry Pease, Mary Ward, Jim Slack, Margaret and Bob Wyckoff, Bing Poon Lu Beale, Alice Swalm, Geoff' Wadey Keith Lyon, Ray McKinley.

- 1. Plans were formulated for forthcoming PVS events.
- 2. Bob and Margaret Wyckoff. Geoff' Wadey and Art Topping will attend the BRSC meeting Sept. 30 as PVS representatives. They will submit a proposal that BRSC be represented at ESA meetings. They will also invite presidents of other clubs to attend PVS EXCOM meetings.
