"IF I CAN DO THIS, I CAN DO ANYTHING" -motto for handicapped skiers.

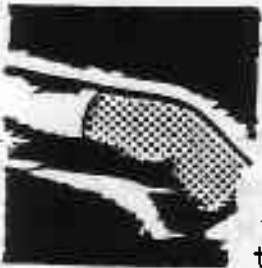
Bob Wyckoff gives one day a week in volunteer work helping handicapped skiers. Following is a description of one of the activities of the organization he works for:

The National Handicapped Sports and Recreation Association (NHSRA) is conducting a "Learn to Ski" clinic for the physically disabled at Hidden Valley Ski Area near Pittsburgh, PA, January 15-18, 1987. The clinic is one of 8 such clinics being held nationwide.

As well as provide instruction to individuals with physical disabilities, the clinic will teach instructors who wish to become proficient in adaptive skiing techniques.

The Nation's Capital Chapter of NHSRA will be taking a group of instructors and skiers to the clinic.

NHSRA was founded in 1967 by a group of Vietnam veterans to provide an opportunity for the war injured to become active and productive members of society through participation in sports and recreation activities. Today, NHSRA serves 10,000 physically disabled veterans and non-veterans annually through a network of 55 chapters in 31 states.
