## WANTED LEADERS FOR SKI TRIPS PLANNED FOR 1990-91 SEASON

A Trip Planning Committee was appointed this fall by the FVS Executive Committee to prepare dates and general locations for our 1990-91 ski season as guidance for prospective trip leaders.

The TPC noted that last winter, PVSers skied some 500 weeks. Of these, only about 130 weeks were on PVS sponsored trips. To assure that next year more than $25 \%$ of our sking is on PVS trips, the five committee members tried to contact as many of you as possible for your ski preferences. We received input from about $2 / 3$ of the membership.

We analyzed the responses and those of the survey of favorite ski areas as listed on this year's membership application. The resuits were similar and unambiguous: the majority of PVSers (over $60 \%$ in both surveys) wants to ski in the west.

Yet, this year, PVS has no organized western trip. We plan to remedy that in 1991.

Our plan, as delineated on the calendar below, calls for five (perhaps six) major trips, two of which are scheduled to include the M.I. King birthday (Jan.21) and President's Day (Feb. 18). Note that we have avoided the crowded pre- and post- Easter week (Mar 31,91) and arranged at least two weeks hiatus between each trip.

* The Dec. trip would be a"warm-up" cancelable if snow conditions poor.
* The Feb. trip to the West should include two different areas with the option of going on one or both.
* The European trip in March would preferably include 2 locations with the option of spending extra time in Europe on one's own.
* The Apr. l-week trip could also be a 2 -week trip if desired
* We would also consider an additional l-week trip to the West the week of January 6,1991 if particularly good rates were available.
* Except for Salt Lake City, most skiers prefer slope-side accommadations and most prefer hotels rather than condos. Also, most prefer flying directly to the area rather than going by bus.

The Trip Committee consisted of Sheldon Drews,Myra Evans, Barbara Leonherdt, Irene Farrell and Ray McKinley, chairman.

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## BAR-B-0 CHICKEN

Your choice of chicken may be used in this recipe. Shahrsad used thighs.

Lay chicken pieces side by side in baking dish. Cover with:

- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 lemon, squeezed over pieces

Cover with foil. Bake 350* for I hour.
You may prepare ahead to this point and chill until 1-2 hours prior to serving.

Mix together:

- 1 Targe Kraft Bar-B-Q sauce
- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar

Spread over chicken. Place under broiler, basting every minute or so, until brown and bubbly. Cover with foil to keep warm until ready to serve.

## CALICO BEANS

Layer 2. Defrost and spread:

- 1 (5-oz) can frozen avocado dip (Mexican is a bit spicier)

Layer 3. Blend together and spread:

- 1 package Taco Seasoning Mix
- 3 Tablespoons mayonnaise
- 3 Tablespoons sour cream

Layer 4. Spread:

- Remainder of 8 oz . carton sour cream

Layer 5. Grate finely and sprinkle over last layer:

- 1/2 1b. Monterey Jack Cheese
- 1/2 1b. Colby Cheddar Cheese

Garnish with chopped black olives, finely chopped scallions, and/or chopped tomatoes. Serve with tortilla chips.

Betty reports that spreading the layers is really an art. Her method is to place several dollops of the mixture to be spread around the last layer and then gently smooth as best you can. This is always a bit at the Chili hike.
