TO HAVE A FULFILLED NEW YEAR TRY THIS RICH, RICH CHEESE CAKE, THE CREATION OF FUMIKO MARQUARDT ANS the headinner of many a pvsee event.

Eake this creany creation in a spring-form pan so cake will unmold neatly. Cut cake iato 12 to 16 wedges. it is gorgeously rich.

9" cramb crust*
packages (8 oz, each) cream cheese
eups sugar for cake
$1 / 8$ teasp. salt
eggs
tgasp: vanilla for cake
cups dairy sour cream for topping
cup sugar for topping
teasp. vanilla for topping

1. Hake and chil1 crimb crust*
2. Let cream cheese soften in large bowl; blend in $1 \frac{1}{4}$ eups sugar $\ddagger$ add salt; beat until fluffy; add eggs one at a time, beat in 1 teaspoon vanilla, pour intio erumb crust.
3. Eake in moderate oven (350 ) 50 minutes, or until firm in center; renove cake from oven; let stand 15 minutes; reset oven to very hot (450 ).
4. Combine sour craam. It enp sugar and 1 tsp. vanilila in a small bowl; spraad over top of cake; return to $450^{\circ}$ oven; bake 10 minutes or just until topping is set; cool cake on wire rack; chill completely.
5. Loosen cake around edge with kntie; ralease sjring ani remove sides of pan; leave cake on metal bate for easy handling and serving.
6. For a party touch top with vafious fruit or combination of figit.

* Crumb Crugt: Combine 2h cups graham oracker crumbs and 4 eup sugar in a smail bowi: blend in $\frac{1}{}$ cup (1 stiok) meltud butter or margarine. Press firmily over bottom and about ${ }^{21 \%}$ " up gides of a heavily buttered 9" spring-form pan; chill while making filling.
